### **Scheduling Parent/Guardian-Teacher Conferences**

Flynn will continue to use the electronic scheduling system, PTC Fast, to schedule our November 2018 Parent-Teacher Conferences. This system will allow you to select the teacher(s) with whom you would like to conference. By registering your email address, you will be able to view and select conference times that work for you.

What if you need to schedule multiple conferences (more than one child at Flynn)?

If you have more than one child at Flynn School, you may begin scheduling your conferences on Friday, November 2rd. You should select (check) all teachers with whom you need to conference from the list of available teachers. You will then be prompted to enter each child's name for the corresponding teachers. When that is done, you can proceed with registering your email address. You will receive a link via email to access and view the teachers' schedules. You will see all selected schedules at one time! # Halloween Costume Guidelines

This memo outlines District guidelines regarding Halloween activities to allow students to feel safe, respected, and included.

The following guidelines shall apply:

Some parents/cultures may not celebrate Halloween and would not like their students participating in any Halloween-related activities. Schools should create a safe space for students who cannot participate and all attempts should be made to engage these students in meaningful alternative activities and help these students not feel excluded.

One of the most important mandates is that costumes shall not be demeaning to any person or group based on age, disability, ethnicity, gender, gender identity (boys as girls and vice versa), nationality, race, religion, sex, sexual orientation or to any individual staff or student at the school. Costumes should be respectful and culturally sensitive, (e.g., non-Muslim students should not wear hijab or other garb that could be viewed as culturally insensitive).

Costumes should not include blood or imply any type of violence. For any student who cannot afford a costume, the school should provide one. No costume can be worn that is unsafe or that may create a safety hazard.

No weapons or replica weapons are to be brought to school. No masks are allowed that completely hide the identity of a student; however, masks may be worn during a parade or other specific activity, provided that safety is not hindered, as determined by the site administrator.
