We need your STUDENT ARTISTS for the **2020 Robert Howe Fire Safety Calendar**

We need your help to assist students in creating fire safety messages this year by participating in the 29th annual Robert Howe Calendar Program organized by the Vermont Department of Public Safety, Division of Fire Safety. The distributed calendars will send fire safety messages and reminders to thousands of homes across the State of Vermont and provides a focused learning experience when the children create fire safety posters for the calendar.

Once the Division receives the artwork from all the schools, a team of judges then selects 12 posters based on each month's designated fire safety message and one poster for the cover to be included in the 29th Annual 2020 Calendar. Once printed, thousands of calendars are then delivered to schools throughout the State of Vermont. The Fire Safety Calendar Program and its integrated messages typically goes hand and hand with many local fire safety programs.

Fire Prevention Week is October 6th through October 12th, 2019. The focus of Fire Prevention Week is to make fire safety a part of daily life throughout the year and the calendar helps coordinate fire prevention topics for each month. Schools and Home-Schooled students can work on the posters before or after fire prevention week, depending on the individual teacher's schedule. The finished posters must be mailed to the Central Office or dropped off at one of the Division's Regional Offices by October 18, 2019. The poster contest is open to all third grade students.

Educators have advised that third grade students are at a good point in their development to understand and promote the issues regarding fire safety. Poster topics should be selected from the themes listed below. Art teachers recommend that big, bold, designs and messages show up the best and attract the interest of the students.
